

General Concept

The Room 18 Pan-European Design Competition has as its subject the designing of the interior of a bedroom in a Greek four-star urban hotel, for two persons, with bathroom, of a total area of 18 - 24m². The aim of the competition is the formulation of new ideas on the design of a space whose basic characteristics are determined by the **specifications of GNTO** (Greek National Tourism Organisation). We are looking for ways of creatively re-interpreting and transcending these specifications in a response to the likely wishes and expectations of the contemporary traveller.

Shape

The outline of the room in terms of ground plan and cross section will be determined by the competitors in such a way that it will contain a net area of ground plan of 18 - 24m² (including any room for insertion of installations), and will allow for its grouping within the building, in terms of juxtaposition and height. The height available is 3.20m (from floor to ceiling in the bearing structure).

Communication

The communication of the room

- → with the enclosed communal areas of the hotel (corridor) will be by means of an appropriately designed entrance;
- → with the open air it will be by means of an appropriately designed french window or door, to be incorporated into the exterior elevation, facing south. The design of any open-air or exterior roofed space is not included among the objects of the competition.

Interior

The interior of the room must satisfy the specifications of the GNTO, according to the attached document. All the rest of the features are to be devised on the creative authority of the designers.

Organisation and co-ordination of the competition

All creative persons, either individually or in the form of a company, or in teams of natural or legal persons, who are engaged in fields of architectural design, interior design, composition of art installations, stage-set design, decoration, and fields related to these are entitled to take part. Those having to do with the organisation or the writing of the volumes of the competition and those who have been involved in the formation or in the preparation of the programme are not entitled to take part directly or indirectly. Entrants must not receive direct or indirect support in connection with the competition from the above persons.

Registration procedure

Registration in the competition is by means of the web site www.room18.gr/registration. All those intending to submit an entry must be registered. In the case of a team of designers, the person responsible for the design certifies by his registration that the members of the team whom he represents consent to his appointment as their representative and confirm that the distribution of the percentages is correct.

Acceptance of the terms of the Competition

By taking part in the Competition, the competitors accept all the terms and provisions of the Competition. The decisions of the award committee are final and not subject to challenge. After the conclusion of the award process and the public exhibition of the designs, the material sent in will be ceded to the Neohellenic Architecture Archives of the Benaki Museum. DOMÉS retains the right of publication, in whatever manner, of the material to be submitted. The competitors retain the intellectual property rights over their work.

Anonymity

The anonymity of the competitors will be maintained for the whole duration of the Competition and the award process, until the taking of the final decision of the Award Committee on the assessment of the proposals. Anonymity will be lifted when the proposals are exhibited. The publication of the proposals will also be by name.

Three cash prizes and six honourable mentions will be awarded on the proposal of the Jury.

Exhibition of entries

On the basis of the Room 18 programme, all the entries in the Competition will be exhibited with the names of the entrants at the Benaki Museum from 23/11/2016 - 11/12/2016. The entries to which the three cash prizes have been awarded will be constructed on the premises of the exhibition on a scale of 1:1, with the collaboration of their creators. The cash prizes are to be understood as compensation for the work carried out by them on the realisation of the designs within the framework and for the duration of the exhibition. For the realisation of the three prize-winning designs, DOMÉS will ensure the collaboration of leading producers and suppliers of building materials, equipment, and accessories relating to the architecture of hospitality. The selection of building materials, equipment, and accessories for the realisation of the three prize-winning designs is restricted exclusively to those available with the producers and suppliers collaborating.



Common Specifications for Two-bed Rooms in Four-star Hotels

- → Bed (minimum dimensions of single beds 0.90m x 1.90m, and of double beds 1.60m x 2.00m)
- \rightarrow Television at least 24", new technology
- → Refrigerator or mini bar
- → Wardrobe
- → Two seats / chairs
- → Small table
- → Table or desk or other working-surface
- → Bedside table or other similar surface
- → Reading-light next to bed
- → Facility for complete light exclusion from the room (e.g., shutters, light-excluding curtain)
- → Bench for luggage (folding or otherwise)
- → Waste paper basket
- \rightarrow Bath or shower with the other sanitary ware and bathroom equipment (bathroom)
- → Mirror (bathroom)
